

any street parking restriction designated by the traffic operations manager may file an appeal to the Board within 30 days of the effective date of the ordinance (for roads where parking has already been restricted by the traffic operations manager, but where no Board resolution exists), or within 30 days of erection of the sign, whichever is later. The Board's authority to restrict parking on a road by resolution is unchanged.

The County Attorney's Office does not recommend sending this ordinance to the Citizen's Ordinance Review Committee (CORC) for review and comment. CORC, in the process of reviewing parking regulations in 2007, recommended that the Board clarify the parking regulations to prohibit blocking the sidewalk. As CORC clearly supports the change, it is unnecessary to send the ordinance back to that committee for further comment. The CAO does not recommend referral of the proposed changes to the LDC Stakeholders' Committee, as that committee is not currently tasked with reviewing the parking regulations codified in Chapter 106 of the Pasco County Code.

ALTERNATIVES AND ANALYSIS:

1. Introduce the attached proposed amendments to Chapter 106 of the Pasco County Code of Ordinances.
2. Do not introduce the attached proposed amendments to Chapter 106 of the Pasco County Code of Ordinances.
3. Direct Staff to some other course of action.

RECOMMENDATION:

The County Attorney's Office recommends that the Board of County Commissioners approve Alternative Number 1, waive the evening hearing by a four fifth's roll call vote, and direct Board Records to advertise the proposed ordinance for final public hearing on November 3, 2009, at 1:30 p.m at the Historic Pasco County Courthouse, Commission Boardroom, 37918 Meridian Avenue, Dade City, Florida.

No funding is required for this item. There will be no impact on the cost of housing, or the additional housing cost is too indirect and speculative to determine an exact amount per unit.
