**Update to Technical Support Document  
for the Intergovernmental Coordination Element**

The purpose of the Intergovernmental Coordination Element is to identify and resolve incompatible goals, objectives, policies and development proposed in local government comprehensive plans and to determine and respond to the needs for coordination processes and procedures with adjacent local governments, and regional and state agencies. In accordance with 9J-5.015, Florida Administrative Code, the update of the Element includes the addition of new policies relative to joint planning/annexation agreements with constituent municipalities, joint planning and coordination initiatives with the District School Board of Pasco County, and coordination with colleges and universities in the review and comment on campus master plans. The inclusion of these new policies also corresponds to the anticipated amendments identified in the Evaluation and Appraisal Report (EAR) as a means to address the major issues identified by County staff, consultants, Board of County Commissioners, the Citizens' Advisory Committee and the Citizens' Advisory Committee Subcommittees. The major issues and the applicable revised/new policies are described below:

## Interlocal Service Delivery Agreement Report (ISDAR)

Section 163.3177(6)(h) 6-8, Florida Statutes, required that all counties with a population greater than 100,000 prepare an Interlocal Service Delivery Agreement Report (ISDAR) that identified the existing and proposed interlocal service delivery agreements in the following categories: a) education, b) sanitary sewer, c) public safety, d) solid waste, e) drainage, f) potable water, g) parks and recreation and, h) transportation facilities. The ISDAR is provided as supplemental data for the EAR-Based Amendments to the Intergovernmental Coordination Element.

### Contents of the ISDAR

The ISDAR consists of the following information:

- Factual overview of how the eight (8) community services listed above are delivered.
- Table 1 – A list of municipalities and special districts within Pasco County.
- Table 2 – An inventory of all existing or proposed interlocal service delivery agreements regarding the eight (8) community services.
- Table 3 – Identification of any duplication in the provision of the eight (8) services, whether capital or operational.
- Table 4 – Identification of any deficits in the provision of the eight (8) services, whether capital or operational.
- Table 5 – Identification of any needed updates that may be required to address a duplication or deficiency in service.

### Types of Agreements

Types of agreements inventoried within an ISDAR may include:

1. Consent votes
2. Interlocal agreements
3. Joint planning agreements
4. Ordinances
5. Memorandum of understanding
6. Resolution
7. Verbal/handshake
8. Other agreements
9. Service without agreement

The ISDAR inventory for Pasco County includes, primarily, interlocal agreements between and among state and local governments. Not included in the inventory are agreements between the County and businesses, developments and private individuals. By direction of the state, municipal service benefit units and municipal service taxing units were not inventoried.

### Principal Definitions

Interlocal Agreement – An interlocal agreement may be defined as any agreement with

another public or private entity addressing one (1) or more of the eight (8) community services listed in the statute.

**Duplication** – Exist where more than one (1) service provider provides the same service or facility to the same customer (this would not include any of the agreements to provide secondary or backup support, such as police or fire protection). Duplications of service only occur when two (2) entities provide the same service within the same (overlapping) geographic area.

**Deficit** – Occurs when one (1) of the eight (8) listed community services is not provided in a portion of the geographic area of the jurisdiction. A deficit also occurs when one (1) of the listed community services is provided at a level below the adopted or generally recognized level of service standard for that type of service.

### **Analysis of Duplication of Service and Deficiencies in Service**

Based on the above definition of “duplication”, no known service duplications have been identified in the ISDAR at this time. Consequently, the ISDAR does not include approaches to address duplications nor recommends updates to any of the inventoried agreements. It is anticipated that additional discussion regarding potential duplications in services, including possible remedies/strategies, will be forthcoming during future meetings from the FDCA in 2004, as provided for in the statute.

The ISDAR identifies deficits in service for the Parks and Recreation functional category with regard to recreational access for publicly owned lands and corresponding needed actions related to development of agreements that provide guidelines and criteria to permit appropriate recreational use of public lands.

### **Service Delivery Arrangements**

Pasco County is a rapidly urbanizing county located on the Gulf of Mexico in the Tampa Bay area and includes the municipalities of New Port Richey, Port Richey, Dade City, St. Leo, San Antonio, and Zephyrhills. Pasco County is part of a nine county region referred to as the "Nature Coast." Within Pasco County there are more than 100 square miles of managed recreational facilities including parks, four artificial reefs (one made up of surplus military tanks), more than 25 golf courses, and three State designated canoe trails. The possibilities to enjoy the outdoors and nature are unlimited. Pasco County also takes pride in the high quality schools, parks, community character, and quality services that are provided to its citizens.

### **Education (ED)**

Pasco County Public Schools includes 35 elementary schools, 11 middle schools, 13 high schools, and 5 charter schools. Service is provided for Pre-K through grade 12 on a countywide basis. Student enrollment in the Pasco County School District is rising at a faster rate than neighboring Hillsborough, Pinellas, and Hernando counties. Between 1998 and 2002, student membership increased by 19.3 percent to reach a total primary and secondary enrollment of 54,957. The projected school enrollment for the 2003 is 54,769. The School Board of Pasco County is solely responsible for public K-12 education throughout Pasco County.

In 2002, Pasco County entered into a pilot program with the Florida Department of Community Affairs to develop an inter-local agreement for the coordination of planning activities among the six (6) municipalities in Pasco County and the District School Board of Pasco County. The Interlocal Agreement was executed by the Pasco County Board of County Commissioners on May 21, 2003.

The Interlocal Agreement provides an opportunity to formalize respective roles and responsibilities regarding land use and school facilities planning, including how responsibilities will be coordinated, how information will be shared and how disagreements will be handled.

In 2001, the Pasco County Board of County Commissioners adopted a school impact fee for new residential development within Pasco County. The impact fee rate for a single-family home is \$1,694 per dwelling unit, and is applied throughout the County.

The School Impact Fee is one method in which the County is proactively addressing the need for adequate school space to meet the growing demand. The collection of this impact fee provides the School District of Pasco County with a dedicated funding source for the acquisition of land and capital construction of the school buildings. However, the impact fee does not provide for the on-going operation and maintenance costs required once the school is in use.

### **Emergency Services (ES)**

Pasco County Emergency Services Department is a full service department providing emergency medical service, including hospital transport, air ambulance service, fire suppression and prevention, hazardous materials mitigation, and technical rescue response. There are 21 stations throughout the County. Fire combat service is provided within the County's MSTU district while medical rescue is provided countywide. Pasco County has recently merged with nearly all of the volunteer fire departments and has recently taken over fire service in the City of Dade City and the Town of St. Leo. The County also provides fire service to the Town of San Antonio. Pasco County contracts with the Florida Division of Forestry for fire and forest protection to the large tracts of State lands in the County. Pasco County also contracts fire service for the Cypress Creek Wellfield.

Pasco County Sheriff's Department is nationally accredited and is the largest and fastest growing law enforcement and correction agency in the southeastern United States. The Sheriff's Office employs over 1,000 employees, which include 350 deputies and 260 corrections officers, and operates the county's two jails. The Sheriff's office provides organizations such as the Uniform Operations Bureau, Special Operations Division, Administrative and Investigative Services Bureau and the Corrections Bureau. The Sheriff's Office also provides community relations services such as Crime Prevention, Citizen's Academy, Safety Town, and Domestic Violence.

### **Parks and Recreation (PR)**

Pasco County manages nearly 10,000 acres of parkland in 34 County parks that offer various amenities from wilderness camping to active sports fields. The Gulf of Mexico lines Pasco County's western border. Pasco County manages nearly one-half mile of the coastline and is equipped with boat ramps, beaches and fishing piers.

The County is home to three State Canoe Trails: Pithlachascotee River Trail, Hillsborough River State Recreation Trail, and the Withlacoochee River Canoe Trail. In addition, the County is the southern terminus of the Withlacoochee State Trail, a linear State park. FDOT is providing recreational opportunities to the citizens of Pasco County as well as the entire region, through the Suncoast Parkway Recreational Trail. This multi-use trail runs along the Suncoast Parkway that stretches from Hillsborough County through Pasco and Hernando Counties. The paved trail is 12 feet wide and provides a great wealth of recreational opportunities as well as an alternative mode of transportation.

There are numerous governmental and quasi-public agencies that own land in Pasco County. Some of these lands provide for public recreational opportunities. These public and quasi-public agencies include the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, Southwest Florida Water Management District, Florida Division of Forestry, the Florida Department of Transportation and the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. In addition to the state agencies, Pinellas County and the City of St. Petersburg have potable water well fields in Pasco County. The Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) is the largest public landowner in Pasco County. Sites include Cypress Creek, Green Swamp West, Upper Hillsborough, Withlacoochee River Park and Starkey. Quasi-public agencies owning land in Pasco County include but are not limited to the Audubon Society and Nature Conservancy.

### **Public Facilities**

*[Sanitary Sewer (SS), Solid Waste (SW), Drainage (DR), Potable Water (PW)]*

According to the "Guidelines for Preparing the Interlocal Service-Delivery Agreement Report," public facilities include public or private utility systems subject to an adopted level of service standard. Pasco County has a major responsibility for the provision of public facilities within the County boundaries, including cooperation with the incorporated cities of New Port Richey, Port Richey, Dade City, and Zephyrhills. Public Facilities and services provided by Pasco County include: (1) sanitary sewer systems, (2) solid waste facilities, (3) drainage operations, and (4) potable water systems. Private service providers participate through agreements with the County to assist in the construction, maintenance, and operation of facilities as appropriate.

### **Transportation (TR)**

According to the "Guidelines for Preparing the Interlocal Service-Delivery Agreement Report," transportation facilities include public or private systems subject to an adopted level of service standard. Pasco County has the major responsibility for the provision of transportation facilities within the County boundaries, including within the incorporated cities of New Port Richey, Port Richey, Dade City, and Zephyrhills. Transportation facilities and services provided by Pasco County include: (1) roadway construction and

maintenance, (2) traffic signal operation and maintenance, (3) public transportation operations, (4) sidewalk and bicycle facility construction and maintenance, (5) landscaping near transportation facilities (either independently or through agreements with FDOT and municipalities), and (6) other miscellaneous facilities and services related to transportation. Private providers participate through contracts let by the County to assist in the construction, maintenance, and operation of facilities as appropriate.

*Note: The enclosed Table 2 provides an inventory of interlocal agreements that relate to the services listed above and demonstrates the intergovernmental coordination Pasco County maintains with other governmental entities, special districts/organizations, etc.*

### STATUTORY REFERENCE

Interlocal Service Delivery Agreement Report

Section 163.3177(6)(h) 6, 7, and 8, Florida Statutes (2002)

6. By January 1, 2004, any county having a population greater than 100,000, and the municipalities and special districts within that county, shall submit a report to the Department of Community Affairs which:
  - a. Identifies all existing or proposed interlocal service-delivery agreements regarding the following: education; sanitary, sewer; public safety; solid waste; drainage; potable water; parks and recreation; and transportation facilities.
  - b. Identifies any deficits or duplication in the provision of services within its jurisdiction, whether capital or operational. Upon request, the Department of Community Affairs shall provide technical assistance to the local governments in identifying deficits or duplication.
7. Within 6 months after submission of the report, the Department of Community Affairs shall, through the appropriate regional planning council, coordinate a meeting of all local governments within the regional planning area to discuss the reports and potential strategies to remedy any identified deficiencies or duplications.
8. Each local government shall update its intergovernmental coordination element based upon the findings in the report submitted pursuant to subparagraph 6. The report may be used as supporting data and analysis for the intergovernmental coordination element.
